- Fall/Winter
 - Poinsettias
 - Christmas Cactus
 - Chrysanthemums
 - Vegetable Transplants
 - Bedding
 - Cyclamen
 - Pansies
 - Snapdragons
 - Petunias
 - Dianthus
 - Perrenials

- Spring/Summer
 - Herbs
 - Vegetables
 - Geraniums
 - Bedding
 - Zinnas
 - Marigolds
 - Impatiens
 - Vinca
 - Begonias
 - Ferns
 - Cacti/Succulents

Seeds vs. Cuttings/Plugs

Seeds

- Inexpensive
- Offer more varieties
- Time consuming
- Germination problems
- Specialized growing environment



Cuttings/Plugs

- Expensive
- Must book in advance
- Consistent growth



Booking Product

- Spring Plants
 - Order in September for a January ship
- Poinsettias/Christmas Cactus
 - Order in February for August ship
- Seeds
 - Order early if you want specific varieties
- Cuttings
 - Order 4 months in advance of your ship date

- Grafting Advanced
- Seed Student Friendly
- Division Student Friendly
- Layering Advanced



Basic Growing Supplies

- Growing Media
 - Sunshine, Metro Mix, Pro Mix
 - Perlite , Vermiculite, Rice Hulls
- Fertilizer
 - Use a quality greenhouse fertilizer such as Peter's, Jacks, or Scotts
 - Understand your water when making a selection
 - Do not use Miracle Grow
- Pots
 - Use new pots or sanitized pots
 - When choosing round pots look for Azalea style pots

Weeds

- Solarize the greenhouse
- Manually remove
- Round Up
- Pramitol
- Rock Salt
- Pre Emergent granules (Preen, Amaze, Halt)
- Newspaper/Cardboard as a barrier



Insects

- Yellow and Blue Sticky Cards
- Use Lady Bugs and Parasitic
 Wasps
- Get rid of infected plants
- Use water to loosen and remove insects
- Insecticides:
 - Insecticidal Soap M-Pede
 - Tame/Orthene followed by Preclude Aerosols
 - Tristar, Safari, Talstar, or Marthon

- Vegetables
 - PDF available online
- Talk with your suppliers
- Switch Modes of Action



Fungi and Diseases

- Manage moisture in the greenhouse
- Allow plants to dry slightly between waterings
- Water the soil not the leaves
- Fungicides
 - Actinovate
 - Banrot
 - Zerotol
- Use as a drench and follow the directions



Water Quality

- Most misunderstood and neglected horticulture management technique
- Test your water yearly
- Everris Testing Lab
 - Robbie Abillama
 - robbie.abillama@everris.us.com
- Can fix problems with fertilizers or acid injection

LOW ALKALINITY PROBLEMS

- Ca & Mg deficiencies
- Sudden drop in substrate pH
- Minor nutrient toxicity
- Bigger problem in long-term crops







Growth Regulators

- Keep plants uniform and internodes short
- B-Nine
 - Spray, very forgiving
- Bonzi
 - Spray or drench, not forgiving
- Florel
 - Spray, not forgiving, cheap
 - Flowers will abort for 6 weeks




Fans and Pads

- Clean your pads once a year
 - Let them dry out
 - Knock off the algae and mineral deposits
 - Use <u>Zerotol</u>, <u>Triatholon</u>, Greenshield or barley straw to control algae
 - Do not use bleach!!!
- Fans
 - Service your fans once a year
 - Tighten or change belts
 - Keep extra belts on hand
 - Keep and extra motor on hand



Glazing Materials

- Clean your glazing material once a season
- Just like washing windows
- Dirt and dust will diminish your light levels
- Use a hose with some soap
- Rinse off well
- Patch holes in poly or replace based on useful life



Disinfecting

- Disinfect your greenhouse after each crop
- Allow the greenhouse to be empty each year for a couple of weeks so that you can clean really well
- Limit your chances of diseases and insect outbreaks
- Clean irrigation system as well
- Zerotol, Triathalon, Greenshield or StarSan
- Use a <u>Foaming Sprayer</u> to apply the chemical available from Nasco
- Disinfect any pots that are going to be reused

Fertilizer Injectors

- Service your fertilizer injector once a year
- Send the unit to the company or fix yourself
- If the injector will not work soak it in a bucket of water for 24 hours
- Keep an extra injector on hand or a lower end kit
- You will need to have an RPZ backflow preventer installed before you injector
- <u>Dosmatic Injectors</u> are recommended

Irrigation Supplies

- <u>Dramm</u>
 - Red Head Water Breaker
 - Color Storm No Kink Hoses
 - Heavy Duty Shut Off Valves
- Netafim
 - Filters
 - Pressure Compensating Drippers
 - Drip Line
 - Dripper Accessories
 - Weights
 - Drip Stakes

Chemical Applicators

- Dramm
 - Chemdose \$2000
 - Apply chemical solution pot by pot
 - MSO Sprayer \$1500
 - Hydraulic sprayer
 - Mini Autofog \$2500
 - Applies chemical solution in a fine mist
 - Controlled by a timer
- Pump Sprayers
 - Gilmour Professional Quality
 - Hand or Backpack
- Use spray tank cleaner!
 - Neutralize
